What office and district are you a candidate for?

1. Do you have a connection to the arts? If so, please share.

YES! I am a member of Arts Center East in Vernon and the Tolland Arts Center. I am also a volunteer for the David Hayes Sculpture Fields. I usually do a lecture/Power Point once a year on the history of the Fields, the life of the artists, a comparison of his work with those he said influenced him, where his sculptures, jewelry, pottery, etc. are on display, and a little local history. Most recently I gave the program this spring at Tolland Public Library followed by a tour of the Fields with the Artist's son, also David Hayes. I enjoy taking friends and relatives to art museums and meeting artists at open studios and art openings.

2. Can you share an arts experience that has impacted your life or the lives of your family members?

This past holiday season, I gave my grandson and his girlfriend a trip to and lunch at the Wadsworth Atheneum and a \$25 gift certificate to the museum gift shop. They had never been there before. I asked if they had not gone with a school field trip and he said that they never went on field trips. Needless to say, we had a wonderful time. In my last position as Director of Credit-Free Programs at Manchester Community College, we offered approximately 100 art related courses every quarter including voice and various musical instrument lessons, jewelry making, pottery, painting with various mediums and styles, history of art classes, artist talks. We also hosted an Organization of Active Adults that at it's peak had 2000 members and hosts musical performers in the College auditorium and takes trips in the US and abroad that include visits to art museums and venues.
